The Gift Card is not a physical card, it sent in an email with a unique gift card certificate code, which can be used to at checkout on the WCCD online store.

The balance on a gift card can be spent on more than one order. Gift card balances are applied to the total value of an order, which can include taxes and shipping. The gift card value does not expire.

In response to concerns voiced by residents in the 2021 Resource Assessment Survey, specifically land use (zoning and pace of development) and fragmentation of forests, the WCCD developed the Community Trees Pilot Project. The project goals included: 1) advertise the benefits of trees, 2) improve residents' understanding of how local ordinances impact trees and land use, 3) provide residents, local officials, and staff with options and ideas for preserving and increasing trees, and 4) encourage participation in local government where residents can most readily influence decisions regarding land use. *Click the button below to continue reading.*
