Tree-of-Heaven and Spotted Lanternfly: An Invasive Species Love Match

Do you have an invasive tree-of-heaven (*Ailanthus altissima*) in your yard, farm, or woodlot? Then you have a love match for the invasive spotted lanternfly (*Lycorma delicatula*). Don't let this insect's strikingly pretty appearance fool you!



This planthopper, native to China and Southeast Asia, damages over 70 species of trees, as well as vines and shrubs, through direct sap feeding as well as indirectly by creating excretions that attract mold. Tree-of-heaven, also native to China and once widely planted in the eastern United States for erosion control and as a street tree, is a highly preferred host plant for the insect.
